(560 hours, 16 weeks)

The Industry Center Training Project is an on-site occupational skills program. Individuals choose an in-person **Industry Center Readiness** track or a **Computer-based Hybrid Learning track**.

A great advantage of this program is that the student has flexibility in selecting his/her path to employment, reducing movement from one program to another while leveraging many resources.
