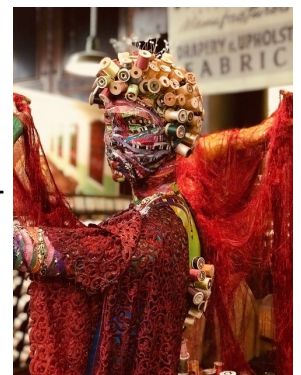
## Seniors Explore the “Mystery of Self”
