Mark Hillringhouse, Assistant Professor of English, will be a featured guest November 19 on National Public Radio's celebrated news program *All Things Considered*. Professor Hillringhouse will be interviewed by producer Art Silverman on the topic of the Passaic River. The program airs from 4:00 pm to 6:30 pm on WNYC-FM 93.9 and WNYC-AM 820. The segment with Professor Hillringhouse is scheduled for 4:30 pm.

Professor Hillringhouse is a published poet, essayist, and photographer whose works have been widely exhibited in area galleries. He has a particular interest in urban landscapes, especially in the historic Paterson area, and his photo-essay on the Passaic River was published last January in the *American Poetry Review*.

Mark Hillringhouse's photography and writing also have been published in *The New York Times*, *The New Jersey Monthly*, *The Paris Review*, and in many other journals, books, anthologies and magazines. He was the founding editor of the *American Book Review*, and a contributing editor for *The New York Arts Journal*.

His recent photo exhibitions include one of his "New York City Bridges" series in the Warner Gallery in Millbrook, New York, and the Main Street Gallery's "Photography Juried Competition" and a one-man show titled "Parts of a World" at the Hamilton Club Gallery. His photography was selected for the "Annual Photography and Graphic Art Exhibition" this June 2009 at the Salmagundi Club on Fifth Avenue in Manhattan.
