## Passaic County Cultural & Heritage Council at Passaic County Community College

is pleased to announce the availability of **Local Arts Program (LAP) re-grants** to **Passaic County organizations** for **arts and cultural projects** planned for 2020.

To be eligible, an applicant must:

1. Be based in Passaic County;
2. Be a non-profit organization with tax-exempt status in NJ, or county or municipal government entity, that is realizing an arts project in Passaic County;
3. Use the grant for an arts project (dance, media arts, music, theater, visual arts, etc.) to take place in Passaic County between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020 and culminate in a public presentation;
4. Have been in existence at least 2 years;
5. Match every dollar with one dollar of its own (a portion of this match can be in-kind);
6. Comply with Labor Standards under Section 5 (1) of the National Foundation of Arts and Humanities Act of 1965, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and may not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, or disability.
